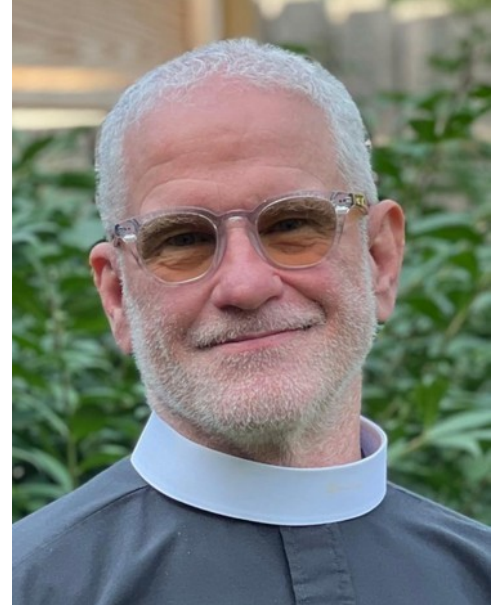

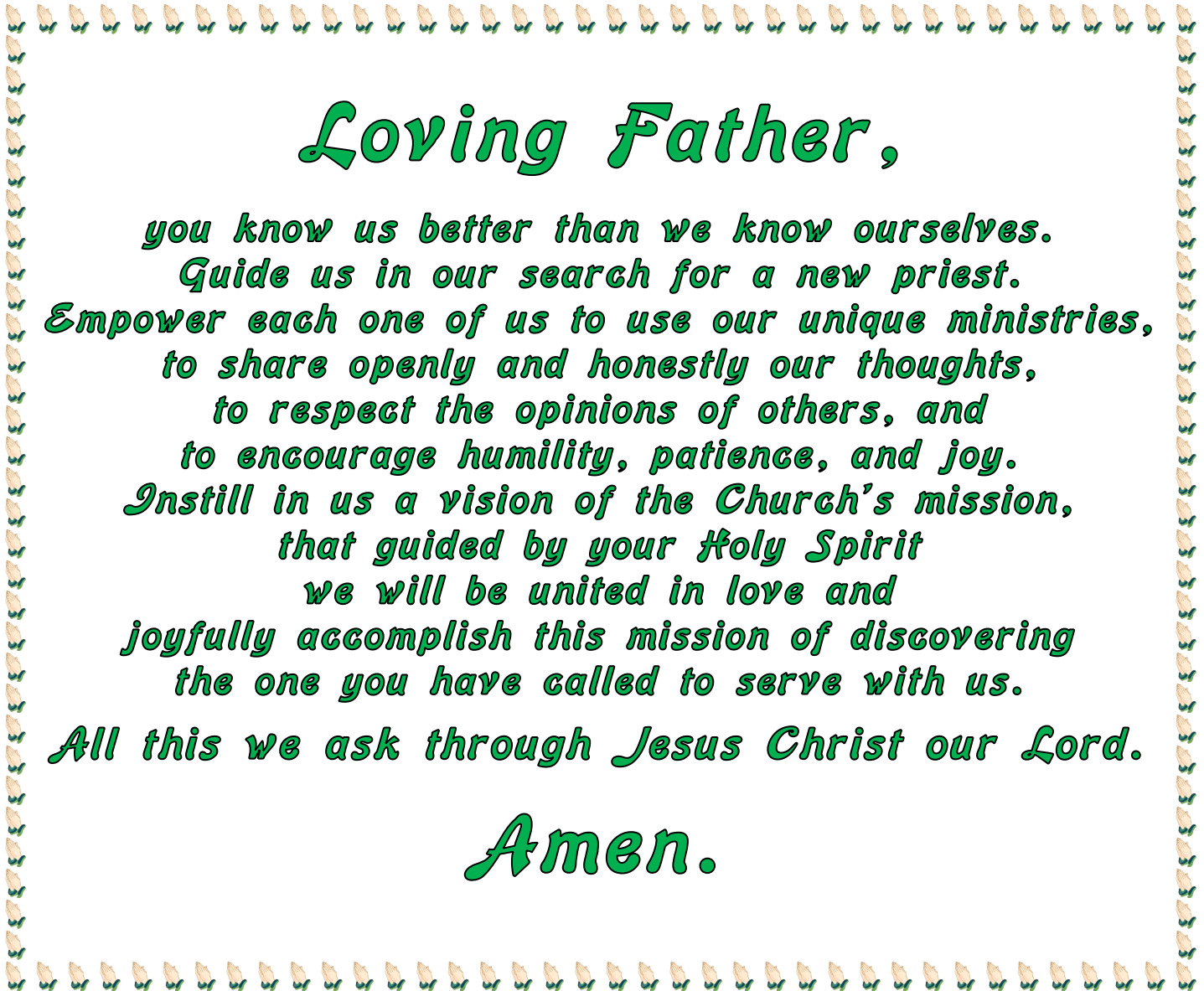
welcome the supply organists on Sundays. We are grateful for those that visit and share their time and talents.

Join the meeting in the Common Room on **Wednesday, July 8th, at Noon**, for the purpose of determining the format of a regular Wednesday noon gathering.

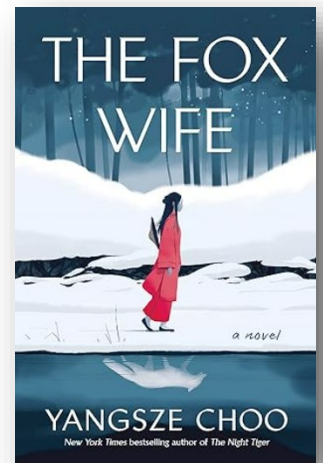
The Good Shepherd Book Club
