On **Saturday, May 30th** at **5:30 p.m.**, after 12 years of faithfully guiding us forward in our journey with Christ, we are celebrating the retirement of Canon Galen. He has been there when we celebrated holidays, births, and deaths. He has been a guiding hand as we struggle with our personal issues and celebrates with us our victories. He shares the communion table with any baptized Christian that comes forward. We shall be sad to have him leave our church. Come! celebrate his retirement and the next leg of his journey with Christ—celebrate Galen and Kim with love and happiness.

Our church community is strong and comes together to get things done. I have seen our community in action as we prepared for Galen's retirement party. We will be fine as we go through the process of finding a new rector. We will need, of course, to remember to laugh, to become engaged in church events, participate in church ministries, and become more interactive among ourselves. Let's talk to one another and listen to one another. We will not be forming a search committee for one or two months. We need time to work through the feelings that Fr. Galen's retirement has stirred up in us as individuals and as a community of faith. On this bittersweet occasion, there are many different feelings that arise for each of us.

Most of all, we need to pray for God's help and guidance. As we deal with those feelings, we are more able to hear from God and follow His plan for us. Please remember this process is not about you **OR** me, it is about you **AND** me. **WE** are on this bumpy road together.

Last April 21st, Canon Chaz Marks, met with our vestry and outlined the process that we are about to embark on as a parish. He is our diocesan advisor who will guide us through the rector search process. He also came to our Sunday service on April 26th for a question-and-answer meeting with those that could attend. I hope that you were able to attend to listen and ask questions.

We will be assigned an interim rector who has been trained in helping congregations through the process of selection. The interim rector will work with the vestry, the selection committee and Canon Chaz to lead us through the process. We expect to have the interim rector known and introduced to the vestry in June. We will continue with all three worship services. We have arranged for supply priests for June and early July. Also, we can have priests available for special services, weddings, funerals. We are going to be fine. It will be different, but like our celebration, it will come together in a wonderful way. We thank God for the privilege of having Eucharist continue for our members.

It is important at this time to recognize who we are and where we are as a parish in the process of finding a new rector. This process will require open dialogue and lots of prayer. The vestry has been working on our church strategic plan. While this may seem foolish at first

glance, it is important to know who we are and where we want our parish to be in the future. This way we can define the matching characteristics of our new rector to lead us in implementing our strategic plan. As the vestry works on the strategic plan, it's important that you share any thoughts with the members of the vestry or send them to us. We will be sharing the first draft sometime in the oncoming months for input from all parish members. We also will be sending a survey to everyone in August to understand your thoughts on a new priest that will help us move forward in the future.

This call process may take longer than we want, but that is not important right now. What is important is how we come together as a community of faith. This is the focus for now. We have the choice to make this experience a blessing or a burden. We know we can come together and accomplish the task before us. We've done it many times before. We know that God is with us on our journey. We will be fine because we have so many wonderful groups doing God's work here. For the size of our church, it is amazing. If you are not already, I encourage you to get involved in one. You'll feel a difference in your life.

I ask you to pray for the vestry and for Good Shepherd Parish as we go on this journey together. May God bless us. Amen.

Wear Orange in Honor of Gun Violence Victims

At the services on **Saturday June 6th & Sunday June 7th**

Wear Orange Day was born out of a tragic shooting in Chicago. On January 21, 2013, Hadiya Pendleton marched in President Obama's second inaugural parade. One week later, Hadiya was shot and killed on a playground in Chicago. Soon after this tragedy, Hadiya's friends commemorated her life by wearing orange, the color hunters wear in the woods to protect themselves and others. Wear Orange is now observed every June.

This year, Bishop Amy Dafler Meaux, along with the Peace and Justice Committee, invites the Diocese of West Missouri to observe Wear Orange Sunday on June 7th, in honor of the victims and survivors of gun violence in our country. Also, Saturday June 6th, please join the Peace and Justice Committee in the **Wear Orange Rally** from 9:00 a.m. - 11:30 a.m. at the **Alvin Brooks Justice Center**. Speakers and vendors will be present from 9:00 - 10:30 a.m.

Afterwards, we will march on Troost Ave in solidarity with victims of gun violence. All are invited to attend the Kansas City Pridefest afterwards to support the LGBTQIA+ community, who are more than twice as likely as their cisgender peers to be a victim of gun violence.

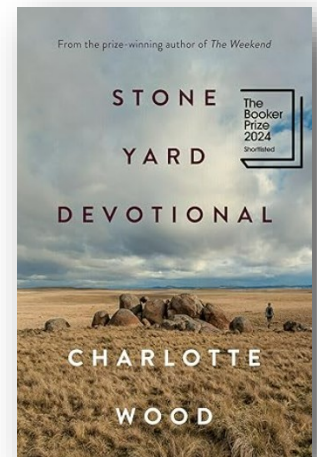

Marie Ebert will lead our discussion of *Stone Yard Devotional* by Charlotte Wood.

A woman joins a cloister of nuns in rural Australia in this artful outing from Wood, which was a finalist for the Booker Prize. The unnamed narrator's decision surprises her husband, from whom she is separated, as well as her friends and even herself, as she's an atheist. In spare, unadorned prose, Wood weaves the narrator's observations of the religious community's day-to-day life in New South Wales with memories of the past, particularly of the narrator's late mother. The plot is driven by a plague of mice at the abbey and the arrival of the remains of Sister Jenny, a former member who died while operating a women's shelter in Thailand. Woods offers subtle insights on the nature of forgiveness and grief. It's an intriguingly secular tale of religious devotion.

Knowledge is Power An Artificial Intelligence Primer



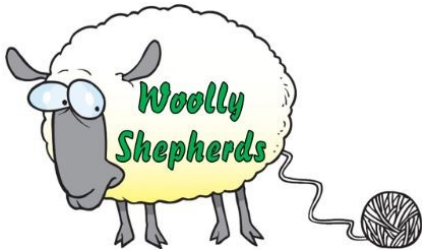
Sunday, June 28th
